Since 2006 the Imagine Youth Ministry has put on English Camps for teenagers from 13-17 years in eastern Germany, a rather poor region that has been affected by socialism and atheism for over 40 years. English Camp consists of language classes, workshops, activities, small group times, evening messages and so much more... It lasts 10 days for the campers. However, the staff meets 4 days in advance in order to prepare, plan and bond as a team. The heart of English Camp is the cross-cultural encounter of German teenagers with native speakers who love Jesus. Our goal is to get to know the campers, to build relationships with them, to live with them and to show them God's love through our lives. Very few of the campers are believers, some know about Christ, some have never heard about the concept of a God before or have a fairly distorted view of Him in their minds. We long to be an open door that leads to Christ and hope that their lives will begin to be transformed through the witness of this community.

YOU should be a part of English Camp, if you are interested in other cultures and have a heart for teenagers. If you are excited about sharing your faith in creative ways and make friendships with new people, you'll be a great fit. Please keep in mind that the idea of a personal God is very strange for most of the campers, so we seek to create an atmosphere of trust and speak about Jesus in a simple and gentle way.

WORKSHOPS

The afternoons at camp offer a wide variety of activities to expose the campers to a different way of learning: hands-on and in small groups according to their interests. We use workshops as a platform to teach crafts, sports, music and much more in creative and communicative ways. Which workshops are offered depends on what each staff member is gifted in and passionate about. Whether it is a claymation workshop, American sports, drama, creative writing or band - it's whatever you can bring to the table! Workshops are a great learning opportunity apart from the traditional classroom setting and an amazing way to get to know and inspire the students.

JOB DESCRIPTION: TEACHER

Do you like to share your gifts and experience in a creative way with others? Each teacher has a class with about 10 students. The camp will have 4-5 classes with different levels. Your job is to show the German students your way of life in its different facets (language, culture, music,...). Many students know a lot of vocabulary, but are afraid to speak because they might make mistakes. The teacher should encourage the students to talk, to feel comfortable with the English language and to not fear grammar mistakes. To create an atmosphere of joy in the class the teacher can use a combination of games and fun ideas - the campers expect 'school' but will really appreciate when you demonstrate more creative and new ways of learning.

JOB DESCRIPTION: MUSICIANS

Do you sing or play an instrument? Are you passionate for music and worship? Then you would be a great fit for our team!

Every year at camp we have our own band for the evening program. Music is an incredible way to captivate and involve the staff and the students; it opens their hearts and minds while they sing along. Especially for the students we see music as a bridge to introduce them to the idea of faith. We sing both popular songs they know & introduce them to new worship songs.

JOB DESCRIPTION: TEAM COACH

Are you an athletic, creative and entertaining person? As a Team Coach it is your job to work with the Activity Coordinator in planning, organizing, and carrying out all activities (games, etc. ...) during the Welcome center, first evening session and the daily activity time in the afternoon. We see the activities as an opportunity to challenge the mind and body, develop teamwork and just have fun! The Activity Coordinator and Team Coaches lead the games, act as juries and give out points to the teams.
